A 3 1/2 hour driving tour all the way around the Salton Sea. Add in time to get out and see some of the quirky sites listed here. • Palm Springs Art Museum

Located in the heart of Palm Springs, the Palm Springs Art Museum features a sophisticated collection of art, loaned or donated by the area's affluent residents. The museum has an art collection that rivals urban metropolitan museums, and includes works from Marc Chagall, Pablo Picasso, Andy Warhol, Roy Lichtenstein, Donald Judd, Louise Bourgeois, Alexander Calder, Henry Moore, Robert Rauschenberg, Antony Gormley and Ansel Adams. Spread over the 150,000 square feet, the museum boasts major collections of modern and contemporary art, glass, photography, architecture, design and Native American art. https://www.psmuseum.org



La Quinta Museum



The La Quinta Museum showcases the city's history and cultural arts. The local history gallery features dioramas depicting native animals and a Cahuilla village, as well as historical resort photos, and a 32-foot long mural of La Quinta, painted by André Blanché, in the community room. Palm Springs Air Museum

At the air museum, history comes alive and visitors can get close to vintage World War II and Korea/Vietnam era aircraft. Named in 2014 as one of the top 14 aviation museums in the world – 59 planes are on display inside four climate-controlled hangars with more outside on the tarmac. Book ahead if you want to fly in the C-47 Skytrain (\$195) or the P-51D Mustang (\$1895) http://palmspringsairmuseum.org



International Banana Museum



The world's largest collection devoted entirely to bananas. There are over 20,000 banana related items from staplers to harmonicas, ash trays to jewelry, sun tan lotion to a record player shaped like a banana, and made of every material you can think of. The folks who toured the Banana Museum in 2018 can attest that they have the best banana shakes you've ever tasted. There's also a gift shop and a selection of banana flavoured sodas. Since the Bananenmusuem in Sierksdorf, Germany, burned down, this quirky museum in the desert is your only chance to see Elvis's favorite banana chocolate bar. http://www.internationalbananamuseum.com/

• Cabot's Pueblo Museum (closed Sundays)

Cabot Yerxa (1883-1965) built his Pueblo to sidplay his colleciton of Native American art and arrifacts, souvenirs of his travels and some of his own artwork. The Hopi-inspired building is hand-made and created from reclaimed and found materials from the valley. Cabot made the adobe bricks onsite. The Pueblo is four stories, 5000 sq.ft., has 35 rooms, 150 windows, 30 different rooflines and 65 doors. • Coachella Valley Preserve

20000+ acres of desert wilderness, wildlife and trails Sparkling springs set amid 20,000 acres of lush greenery provide a haven for a myriad desert creatures. In the center is a 1000-acre, idyllic palm oasis that served as the backdrop for Cecil De Mille's epic film, King of Kings. Self-guided nature trails, guided tours, horse trails, and picnic facilities are available. The hiking trails range from flat and easy to quite difficult. • Living Desert Zoo and Gardens



A showcase of the plants and animals that have adopted to survive in the desert. More than 450 desert animals from deserts in Africa to Madagascar to North America can be seen in gardens with the native flora from each desert. There is an interactive Discovery Center, a large G-scale model train display, hiking trails and more. This is a great outing for children and adults alike. <u>https://www.livingdesert.org/</u>

• Joshua Tree National Park

Two desert ecosystems, the Mojave and the Colorado, meet in Joshua Tree. The land, carved by wind and rain, hold a fascinating variety of plants and animals. The Visitor Center opens at 7:30, so you can visit before the temperture gets too hot. https://www.nps.gov/jotr/index.htm
